for every player and some spares.
Dice - One per table and a couple of spares
Beetle print out and scoring card - One per player with spares for additional players.
Cloakroom tickets for your raffle or cloakroom - Buy them online or from high street stationers
Float - and something to keep the money in
Volunteer promotional materials - Take along your region's recruitment flyers or order some from girlguidingshop.co.uk (search 'recruitment'. Materials are free but there's a postage charge). Put them on tables - and the backs of toilet doors.
Microphone - Depending on the size of your room, you may need a PA system to explain the game to new players, or something to make a noise to indicate the end of a round.
Prizes - Ask local businesses for support or get cheap prizes like chocolate bars. You're allowed to take reasonable expenses from your event proceeds as long as you keep a record in your unit accounts.

Why not try a twist on the classic game by making beetle biscuits?

Each player starts with a round biscuit (a rich tea or a digestive work well). The 'body' is made of a layer of icing and the remaining beetle parts can be made of sweets - think strawberry laces, chocolate buttons and jelly sweets.

Be aware, this can get messy - so don't forget to bring something to wipe down the tables at the end, or newspaper to protect them!
